Teensie: Lottie Dottie



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Finished Size

5 Inches/12.70 cm

Supplies and Materials

Yarn

- YarnEnd Amigurumi
3 Aran 50gr / 130m
 - Beige 005 (A)
 - White 002 (B)
 - Yellow 006 (C)
 - Baby Blue 018 (D)
 - Pink 033 (E)
- Embroidery Thread
 - Black (AA)

Hook size: 2.5 mm

Polyester Fiber Filling

Embroidery Needle

Stitch Marker

Scissors

Sewing Pins

Abbreviations

- MC = Magic Circle
- CH = Chain
- SLST = Slip Stitch
- ST or STS = Stitch/es
- SC = Single Crochet
- HDC = Half Double Crochet
- INC = Increase
- DEC = Decrease
- BLO = Back Loop Only
- FLO = Front Loop Only
- X = Times or Repeat
- F/O = Finish Off

NOTES:

- ❑ I suggest that you first read each section before starting.
- ❑ Pieces are crocheted separately and then sewn together.
- ❑ Stuff each piece gradually as you go.
- ❑ The use of stitch markers at the beginning of each row is highly recommended.
- ❑ Work in continuous spiral rounds. Unless specified, do not join at the end of each round.
- ❑ Finishing off or fastening off your pieces are done in many ways. For a complete closed piece, weave your yarn with an embroidery needle under the front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close the gap and hide the extra yarn in the center of the piece. Finishing an open piece that attaches to another, you can do a slip stitch to the first stitch, cut the yarn, weave in the end and then hide it in that piece. There are other ways to do an invisible finish. Please research this and find the best way for you to complete each of your pieces.
- ❑ After completing the pieces that are stuffed, shape them with your hands by gently squeezing the sides and/or the top and bottom of the pieces to create a perfect shape.
- ❑ To get the right placement of each piece, use pins to place them before sewing together. You can never have too many pins.
- ❑ When I crochet my patterns, I always use an invisible decrease. This is an option for you to use or learn, to have a cleaner looking decrease when working a pattern. The decreases in this pattern are basic stitches to keep it simple. Although I encourage you to seek out ways to use invisible stitches in your work. You will NOT be disappointed!

LEGS AND PANTS

Make 2 legs.

Round 1: Using yarn B, make a MC with 6 SC

Round 2: INC x 6 (12)

Round 3: SC 1, INC x 6 (18)

Change color to C.

Round 4: SC in each ST around BLO (18)

Round 5-6: SC in each ST around (18)

(2 rounds)

Change color to D.

Round 7: SC in each ST around BLO (18)

* If on the first leg, cut yarn and F/O. If on the second leg, continue to Round 8.

Round 8: SC in each ST around (18), CH, SC to first leg (make sure to connect the SC a stitch after where you F/O), SC 18, SC in the back of the CH (38) *The chain counts as stitch.

Round 9: SC in each ST around (38)

Round 10: SC 8, INC 2, SC 17, INC 2, SC 9 (42)

Round 11-14: SC in each ST around (42)
(4 rounds)

Round 15: SC 5, DEC x 6 (36)

Round 16: SC 2, DEC, SC 2 x 6 (30)

F/O, hide tails inside the body and finish stuffing.



FRONT OF PANTS - BIB and STRAPS

To mark the location of the bib, place two stitch markers on the FLO of the last round of the pants. Make sure they are 8 stitches apart and centered in the middle of the pants. Attach yarn D to the right-hand stitch.

Row 1: SC 8 FLO, CH, turn (8)

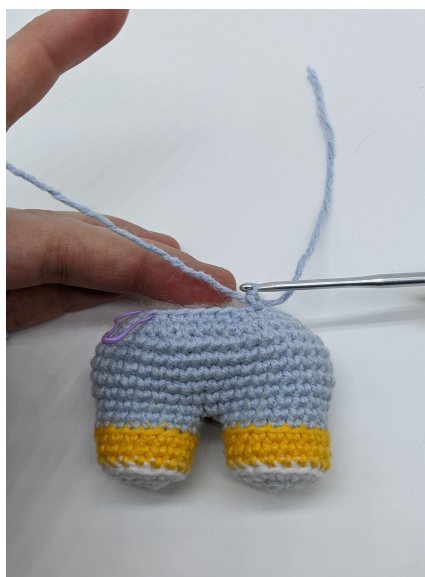
Row 2-5: SC 8, CH, turn (8) (4 rows)

Row 6: SC 8, CH 12 (these chains will create the strap.) (20)

F/O and leave a long tail for attaching.

Attach yarn D to the other corner of the bib and chain 12. (12)

F/O and leave a long tail for attaching.



HEAD AND SHIRT

Round 1: Using yarn A, make a MC with 6 SC

Round 2: INC x 6 (12)

Round 3: SC 1, INC x 6 (18)

Round 4: SC 1, INC, SC 1 x 6 (24)

Round 5: SC 3, INC x 6 (30)

Round 6: SC 2, INC, SC 2 x 6 (36)

Round 7: SC 5, INC x 6 (42)

Round 8: SC 3, INC, SC 3 x 6 (48)

Round 9-13: SC in each ST around (48)
(5 Rounds)

Round 14: SC 3, DEC, SC 3 x 6 (42)

Round 15: SC 5, DEC x 6 (36)

Round 16: SC 2, DEC, SC 2 x 6 (30)

Round 17: SC 3, DEC x 6 (24)

Round 18: SC 1, DEC, SC 1 x 6 (18)

Round 19: SC 1, DEC x 6 (12)

Round 20-21: SC in each ST around (12)
(2 Rounds)

Round 22: SC 1, INC x 6 (18)

Continue stuffing and change color to B.

Round 23: SC in each ST around (18)

Round 24: SC 1, INC, SC 1 x 6 (24)

Round 25-26: SC in each ST around (24)
(2 Rounds)

Round 27: SC 3, INC x 6 (30)

Round 28: SC in each ST around (30)

Do Not cut the yarn. Finish stuffing.



CONNECTING THE BODY

Line up the back of the shirt and the back of the pants. Please note that you will make the next round while the doll is upside down. Continue the shirt, connect both parts by SC through the shirt stitch and the BLO of the last round of the pants. (30) Include extra stuffing before closing altogether.

F/O and hide the tail inside the body.



ARMS

Make 2

Round 1: Using yarn A, make a MC with 6 SC

Round 2: SC 1, INC x 3 (9)

Round 3-8: SC in each ST around (9)

(6 rounds)

Change color to B.

Round 9-12: SC in each ST around (9)

(4 rounds)

Round 13: SC 1, DEC x 3 (6)

Slightly stuff.

F/O, weave yarn under all FLO and pull tight. Leaving a long tail for attaching.



EARS

Make 2

Round 1: Using yarn A, make a MC with 6 HDC, CH 2, turn (do not close circle too tight)

Round 2: HDC in each ST across (6)

Leave a long tail for attaching.



HAIR

Round 1: Using yarn E, make a MC with 6 SC

Round 2: INC x 6 (12)

Round 3: SC 1, INC x 6 (18)

Round 4: SC 1, INC, SC 1 x 6 (24)

Round 5: SC 3, INC x 6 (30)

Round 6: SC 2, INC, SC 2 x 6 (36)

Round 7: SC 5, INC x 6 (42)

Round 8-12: SC in each ST around (42)

(5 Rounds)

Next, you will be working chains off of round 13, creating bangs and curls.

Please note: All SLST will be made in the next ST.

Round 13: SC 16

- Curl 1: CH 15, turn, SC 14, SLST
- Curl 2: CH 13, turn, SC 12, SLST 2
- Curl 3: CH 4, turn, SC 3, SLST
- Curl 4: CH 5, turn, SC 4, SLST
- Curl 5: CH 4, turn, SC 3, SLST 2
- Curl 6: CH 4, Turn, SC 3, SLST
- Curl 7: CH 5, turn, SC 4, SLST
- Curl 8: CH 4, turn, SC 3, SLST
- Curl 9: CH 11, turn, SC 10, SLST 2
- Curl 10: CH 15, turn, SC 14, SLST, SC 13

F/O, leaving a long tail for attaching.

BUN

To make the bun, use yarn E and cut a piece 12 inches long and set aside. Then take more yarn and wrap it around 3 fingers 75-80 times. Cut the yarn. Carefully take the yarn off your fingers and place it on the shorter cut yarn. Then tie the yarn around the clump of yarn and pull tight.



ATTACHING PIECES AND ADDING DETAILS

HAIR PART 1

Pin the hair on the head with 6 rows showing on the back of the neck and lower head. This will leave 16 rows from the bottom of the front of the neck to the hair. Before attaching, place pins marking the eyes 11-12 rows above the shirt line with 5 stitches between. * See photos. Pin the hair curls down to the face in the placement you prefer.



EARS

Pin the ears to the side of the head. There should be at least 4 stitches between each eye and each ear. They also should be positioned where the top of the ear is lined up to the top of the eye. Adjust the longer hair curls around each ear if you need. When the ears look even, attach with an embroidery needle.

HAIR PART 2

Attach the hair by sewing around the head in a circle. Then come back and sew each of the hair curls down where you had pinned them in place. Hide all tails inside the head.



ARMS AND STRAPS

Starting on the side of the body, 1 row down from the top of the shirt color and 7 stitches between, attach the arms on each side of the body. Try attaching them where your color change is under the arms. If you require the arms to lay more against the body, you can always add a few wip stitches near the middle of the arms to secure the arms down. Hide all tails inside the body.

Sew each of the straps from the front of the bib, to the left over FLO on the back of the pants at the waist. They should be approximately 5 stitches apart. Hide all tails inside the body.



BUN

Now time to sew the bun to the top of the head. Make sure to sew down the bun multiple times to prevent it from coming loose.

EYE DETAILS

Using embroidery thread AA, enter the needle through the side of the head and out the front bottom corner of the first eye. At this time, insert your needle back through the inside corner of the eye. This will outline the eye. Pull the yarn up through the top pin location, wrap the needle around the thread and out the same stitch. Pull the thread down through the side of the head where you originally started. Tie off and hide yarn inside the head. Repeat steps for the second eye.



NOSE

Using yarn A, make a nose by wrapping the yarn around 2 stitches in the center of the face. Hide tails inside the head. *See photo on next page.
